The cost is \$4 per child/participant and no cost for adults. ** Typical tours are 2 hours long and available Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. The Farm is closed on school holidays.

When you arrive please drive around the Rainier loop and park on the street. Sign in at the front gate and have a seat in the log circle. Farm staff will provide an orientation then your group will explore the Farm on a self-guided tour. Picnic areas are available to enjoy a bag lunch from home/school.

Bringing food in to feed the animals is no longer allowed due to health concerns for the animals. The children are encouraged to observe similarities and differences in the animals and use their senses such as touch and hearing. The Farm offers a great variety of plant and animal life that creates a dynamic learning environment.

The educational goal of Loma Vista Farm is for students to learn about animals and plants in ways that meet the California State Standards. The Farm provides the opportunity to fulfill the educational goals of Life Science Standards and enhances math and language arts standards.
